





6. Does the client wish to bequeath specific real or personal property to one or more persons or entities?

NO

- If the client does not have any specific possession that he or she would like to bequeath, the will can generally leave the estate or a portion of the estate to whomever the client chooses.
- If the client decides to make specific bequests, the will should clearly state the bequest with enough detail to withstand in a court if the will is contested.

YES

- If the client wishes to make specific, individual bequests, the will needs to state what property the client wishes to give and to whom.
- The will should be clear and specific as to the property and the person.
- For example: Instead of “my ring to my daughter” the will should state, “my pear-shaped opal and diamond ring to my eldest daughter, Jaimee Doe.”
